



MISSION




PRE-REQUISITES FOR ADMISSION INTO MD PROGRAM

Age	Minimum 18 years
<p>Education</p>	<p>A. High/Secondary school completion from a regionally accredited school is required</p> <p>B. Within the last 10 years, Undergraduate / Bachelors / Associate / College / Premedical studies from a regionally accredited school/college, accumulating a minimum of 90 credits which included the following is required --</p> <p>One year of Biology / Zoology with lab (8 credits)- One year of General / Inorganic Chemistry with lab (8 credits)- One year of Organic Chemistry with lab (8 credits)- One year of Physics with lab (8 credits)- One year of English (6 credits)</p> <p>C. The following is optional – one semester of Mathematics (calculus or statistics)</p> <p>D. A total GPA of 3.0 or higher is preferred. Applicants with lower GPA scores should present compelling letters of recommendation and a personal statement to demonstrate that they have a strong commitment to pursuing a career in medicine.</p> <p>E. MCAT is recommended, but not required, for USA's applicants.</p> <p>F. Indian applicants- if you wish to get licensed in India then NEET qualification is required (50th percentile for general category and 40th percentile for special reservations). NEET is not a requirement if you wish to get licensed to practice in all other countries including Antigua, USA, UK, etc.</p> <p>G. If the above required credits were not taught in English, then TOEFL or IELTS is required.</p> <p>H. An English translation of non-English transcripts will have to be submitted.</p> <p>I. Official transcript needs to be sent directly from your school</p>



If you are missing any of the requirements listed above, then please consider MUCM's premedical program which will award you the required premedical credits allowing you a seamless transition into MUCM's MD class.</p> <p>C. Any equivalency or acceptance of other allied healthsciences, pharmacy, nursing, or other related biological sciences credits to suffice for the above can be only evaluated after reviewing your transcripts.</p> <p>D. If your credits are more than 10 years old or you are looking to transition from arts or non-medical fields then your profile may be evaluated for admissions into MUCM's premedical program with later transition into MUCM's MD program.</p>
Transfer students acceptance	<p>Individuals seeking to transfer from another medical school may be considered under exceptional circumstances. Please reach out to the admissions office for further details. The previous medical school must be listed in The World Directory of Medical Schools at https://www.wdoms.org/ and have no negative sponsor notes during the time at which the student finished the transfer credits.</p>

- The Clinical Sciences Semester tuition is the same regardless of the location of the affiliate hospital where the clerkship placement is done.
- Teaching hospitals periodically review and update their fees, and the tuition for the final two years is subjective to change based on those alterations.
- Tuition may be paid in monthly instalments at 0% APR; However, all such payment plans must be approved by the university management in advance.
- Please also note if a student fails a course that needs to be repeated, there will be an additional tuition charge per repetition.
- Tuition does not include administrative fees, housing and meals, please refer to the "Other Fees" section for details.
- Please be aware of published refund policies and disclosures.
- Please note that Antiguan citizens may receive special scholarship of up to 25% for Premedical and Basic Science Semesters.
- Ask us about special scholarships for CARICOM citizens
- While the institution will assist the students in Visa application process, we do not guarantee VISAs to any foreign countries.
- Scholarships are available for international students (non-CARICOM) periodically, subject to academic review and at the discretion of the management.

One-Time application Fee	\$150	A nonrefundable fee charged for application processing.
One-time Registration Fee	\$1000	A nonrefundable fee charged at the time of initial admission to confirm the acceptance of admission offer letter.
Seat-reservation fees	\$1000	Fee charged at the time of initial admission to reserve your seat, fee will be applied towards your semester tuition. Refundable if admission is withdrawn before 2 weeks of semester start date.
Transcript Fee	\$25 for administrative expenses	Charged when a student asks for an official transcript during their study period. Postage costs will be extra.
Diploma Fee	\$100	Charged when a student asks for an official transcript during their study period. Postage costs will be extra.

REFUND POLICY

The refund will be applicable as below*:

1. Seat Reservation Fees and E-resources fees are non-refundable even if the student is eligible for full refund. Similarly, any fees paid to immigration, hospitals, or other government departments for facilitating visa assistance will be non-refundable.
2. All refunds are to be requested by the student in writing. The date of refund request will be the date the request was received by the school.
3. Generally, for a full refund, the deadline is before the start of the semester in basic sciences and before the confirmation of a schedule in clinical sciences.


FINANCIAL AID

You may qualify for the following financial aid:

1. For Antiguan applicants- the department of education may nominate 2-3 students per year who will receive full scholarships for the premedical sciences and basic medical sciences.
2. For all Antiguan applicants- MUCM gives 50% scholarships in the premedical sciences and basic medical sciences years, with the condition to continue at MUCM to finish their medical school. These students will pay 50% of the tuition rate for all premedical semesters and basic science semesters. This aligns with our commitment to the local community and reflects our sincere interest in supporting the development of future physicians in the Caribbean.
3. For Indian applicants- they may be eligible to receive education loans from State Bank of India (SBI) and many other private banks. The amount that can be financed varies and such information can be obtained on these bank websites.
4. For US and Canadian applicants- Currently, MUCM does not have federal loans. However, we offer a very affordable tuition package which makes it very feasible to obtain high-quality education. Please keep in mind that you may have to spend many years paying back the expensive educational loans that many schools ask for, see the table of comparisons in tuitions. Hence, it's up to you to decide on the tradeoff between a high-quality affordable education at MUCM vs very expensive tuition paid via loans at some of the other accredited institutions. Finally, MUCM is in the process of securing federal and other loans for the upcoming year, however, we cannot give a definitive timeline for its completion at this time.
5. MUCM offers 0% APR installment plans to be paid monthly but need to be approved in advance, please talk to an admission specialist.
6. MUCM offers significant discounts on annual payments vs semesterly payments, please see the tables above in the tuition section.
7. Referral aid system- Students are the best advocates for a school. They have experienced the quality of education and the support the school offers. As such, a good word from them goes a long way. If a student successfully refers another student to join the program, then the referral aid discount of \$2000 USD/referral is applied to the student who has referred with no limit on number of referrals. This is awarded in the following semester after the second student has finished an academic year. To gain a full referral amount, the new student must have joined within the 1st year of the MD program. Please talk to an admissions specialist for full details.

DEAN OF THE MEDICAL SCHOOL



We also emphasize strongly on the clinical application of the basic knowledge along with clinical skills training in the first two years which makes the transitioning into clinical years more streamlined. We have a low student-to-faculty ratio which enables our faculty to focus on individual student needs and provides maximum faculty mentorship for every student. One of the most essential parts of our program is our student services and staff who work tirelessly to perfect the student's wellbeing in every aspect of student life and, as in student's own words, act as the strongest pillars of support for our students.
