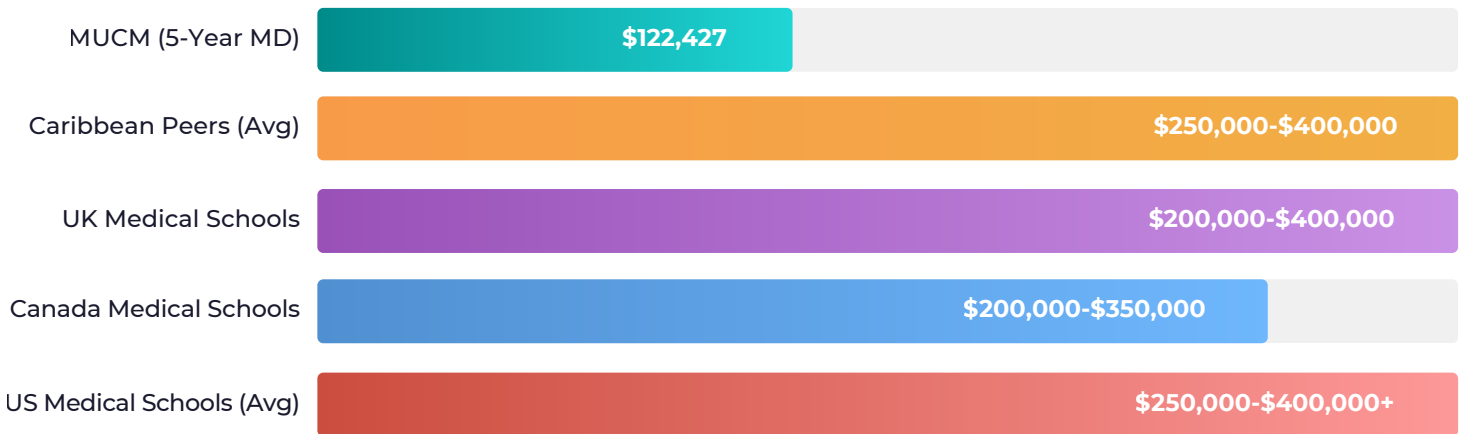

Global Licensing Pathways

An MUCM Doctor of Medicine degree opens doors to medical practice across the globe. Our WDOMS listing, CAAM-HP/WFME accreditation, and ECFMG recognition ensure that graduates are eligible for licensing examinations and medical registration in virtually every major healthcare system worldwide.

United States (USMLE)

Pass USMLE Step 1 (Basic Sciences) and Step 2 CK (Clinical Knowledge). Obtain ECFMG certification. Apply to residency programs through the NRMP Match. Practice across the United States.

Canada (MCCQE)

Pass MCCQE Part 1. Apply for provincial medical licensing. Enter residency through CaRMS. Practice across all Canadian provinces and territories

United Kingdom (PLAB / GMC)

Pass PLAB 1 (Knowledge) and PLAB 2 (Clinical Skills). Register with the General Medical Council (GMC). Enter Foundation Year training. Practice in the UK and Crown Dependencies.

India (NMC / FMGE)

Pass the Foreign Medical Graduate Examination (FMGE) / NMC Screening Test. Register with the National Medical Commission. Practice in India.

South Africa (HPCSA)

Register with the Health Professions Council of South Africa. Complete board examinations. Enter community service. Practice in South Africa.

CARICOM Nations

Direct recognition across Caribbean Community member states including Jamaica, Trinidad & Tobago, Barbados, Guyana, and others. Streamlined registration process.

Middle East (UAE, Saudi, Qatar)

WDOMS listing enables registration with national health authorities including DHA (Dubai), HAAD (Abu Dhabi), SCFHS (Saudi Arabia), and QCHP (Qatar).
